FINANCES

£79 million will be made available every year until 2025 for the Music Hubs programme.

LESSONS

Every pupil to have at least one hour per week of highquality music education in key stages 1-3.

DEVELOPMENT

Pilot to improve music progression in disadvantaged areas and the rollout of an inclusion strategy in every music hub area.



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INSTRUMENT ACCESS

£25 million for schools to purchase musical instruments and equipment, including adapted instruments for pupils with special educational needs and disabilities.
